Amtrak	Nationwide Passenger Rail Organization with service in entire northeast corridor.
Archive Data Users	Users of archived data.
Commercial Vehicle Operators	Private commercial vehicle operators
ConnDOT	Connecticut Department of Transportation
CT DEMHS	Connecticut Department of Emergency Management and Homeland Security. Responsible for coordinating homeland security communications systems in the State of Connecticut and for distributing information and security warnings. The agency is also charged with establishing standards and protocols for use of any intelligence information.
CT Department of Environmental Protection	Provides permitting for HAZMAT and environmental monitoring.
CT DMV	State of Connecticut Department of Motor Vehicles. Provides permits for commercial vehicles.
CT DPS	Connecticut Department of Public Safety. Includes Connecticut State Police; and Fire, Emergency, & Building Services.
CT National Guard	A dual state-Federal force, commanded by the governor of the State of Connecticut.
CT Transit	Provides fixed route public transit services in the Greater Hartford, New Haven, and Stamford, Connecticut.
Ferry Operators	Owners and operators of ferry service. This includes the Connecticut Department of Transportation, Bridgeport and Port Jefferson Steamboat Company, and Cross Sound Ferry.
Financial Institution	Banks involved in the transfer of funds for toll and fare collection as well as for other fee based transportation services.
IAG Agencies	IAG - Inter-Agency Group. E-ZPass Agencies coalition responsible for maintaining and coordinating the interoperability standards for its member agencies.
Independent School Districts	Includes public schools throughout the study region.
Local Media	Includes both print (newspaper) and broadcast (TV, radio) news media.
MTA Metro North Railroad	MTA Metro North Railroad
MTA Police	Metropolitan Transportation Authority Police
Municipal or Regional Government	Regional or local city/town offices and departments.
Municipal or Regional Public Safety	Regional or local city/town agencies responsible for emergency coordination.
Municipal Public Works Department	Local city department responsible for street maintenance.
NOAA	National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (National Weather Service).
NYMTC/DCP	Joint New York Metropolitan Council/New York City Department of City Planning stakeholders
Other States Agencies	Represents the agencies and departments of neighboring states.
Private Ambulance	Private ambulance companies in the region.
Private Information Service Providers	Local, regional and national information service providers that provide travel information, including local media (print, TV and radio), Internet sites, service bureaus, etc
Private Maintenance Contractor	Private contractors providing maintenance functions.

Private Parking Operators	Operators of public or private parking facilities, including park-and-ride facilities. May include bus shuttle services provided by private park-and-ride facilities.
Private Taxi Providers	Private companies providing taxi service.
Private Tow/Wrecker Providers	Private towing companies
Private Transit Providers	Represents other transit providers, including intercity bus carriers, private shuttle operators, and commuter bus operators.
Private Travelers	Traveling public accessing various modes of transportation, including surface street, air, rail/transit, and non-motorized.
Rail Operators	Operators of private rail systems, including passenger and freight.
Regional Emergency and Public Safety Agencies	Provide response for natural and man-made disasters and emergencies.
Regional Medical Center	Hospital/trauma centers in the region.
Regional Planning Organizations	Represents Regional Planning Agencies and Council of Governments in the State of Connecticut. These include: CCRPA - Central Connecticut Regional Planning Agency, COGCV - Council of Governments of the Central Naugatuck Valley, CRCOG - Capitol Region Council of Governments, CRERPA - Connecticut River Estuary Regional Planning Agency, GBRPA - Greater Bridgeport Regional Planning Agency, HVCEO - Housatonic Valley Council of Elected Officials, LHCEO - Litchfield Hills Council of Elected Officials, MRPA - Midstate Regional Planning Agency, NECCOG - Northeastern Connecticut Council of Governments, NWCCOG - Northwestern Connecticut Council of Governments, SCRCOG - South Central Regional Council of Governments, SWRPA - South Western Regional Planning Agency, SECCOG - Southeastern Connecticut Council of Governments, VCOG - Valley Council of Governments, and WINCOG - Windham Region Council of Governments.

State of Connecticut	State government agencies and departments.
Toll Agency	Future toll road operating authority
TRANSCOM	Consortium of transportation and emergency management agencies in the tri-state region (Connecticut, New Jersey, New York)
U.S. Coast Guard	The United States Coast Guard.
Vanpools	Transportation Management Associations and non-profit organizations providing vanpools, limited demand response service, and transit information. Includes RideWork, RideShare, and Metropool.
